Greetings from the Art Room!

Each grade level is organized with a central idea for the entire year. Each of the individual projects are guided by these concepts. When there is a relevant connection, the art projects support the Unit of Inquiry of each grade. Here is a look at what is happening in art:

Kindergarten: **Experimentation and exploration communicates the language of art.** Kindergarteners are experimenting with paper to create amusement parks and jumping frogs.

First Grade: **Artists tell stories that connect the world around them.** First grade artists are drawing portraits Ruby Bridges, Cesar Chavez and Malala to accompany the influential people unit in their classroom.

Second Grade: **Art can enrich a community.** Students have finished a unit on art in public places and are creating covers for the habitat books they are making in the classroom.

Third Grade: **Art preserves history and culture.** Third graders are starting a puppet unit to correlate to the storytelling unit in the classroom. Students will fold origami puppets and learn basic sewing skills to create a hand puppet.

Fourth Grade: **Art expresses different points of view.** Students are finishing the optical illusion projects. We will be starting to create 2-D and 3-D imaginary creatures as we investigate dragons, fairies and other mythological creatures.

Fifth Grade: **Artists can transform the ordinary into the extraordinary.** Artists have been creating abstract artwork inspired by music. They are currently creating torn paper pictures in the style of Wassily Kandinsky's *Concentric Circles*.
