CMAS testing

Hi Bennett Families!

Spring is coming, and along with anticipating nicer weather and week off from school, we are also starting to gear up for CMAS/PARCC testing in grades 3 - 5.

For 2021, Bennett's main testing sessions will be **April 6**th – **April 8**th (Math) and **April 13**th – **15**th (English Language Arts). 5th grade (only) will also test in Science from **April 20**th –

22nd. Makeups sessions for absent students will be scheduled as needed and may continue through **April 30**th.

But please don't feel that testing will be the only thing happening in your child's classroom those <u>days!</u> The majority of your child's day will be spent as normal, including specials, recess, lunch, most academic subjects, and 5th grade Exhibition.

We appreciate you planning appointments and absences around testing times whenever possible. It is better for students to be able to test with their classes, but we obviously understand if there is an unavoidable scheduling conflict or illness. When we begin testing on a given day, students cannot stop their test and then go back to finish it another time. Also, if they are late, they won't be able to begin the test with their class. They will have to take that particular session on a makeup day.

We have begun introducing the processes and tools the students will be using on the computer-based tests this year, so they are comfortable physically, mentally, and emotionally before starting. We at Bennett feel that this time should be as low stress as possible, so we try not to overemphasize these tests. We know our students are extraordinary, and we treat this as just another opportunity to prove it!

If there are any changes to the CMAS schedule due to Covid, we will let you know as soon as possible. Otherwise, if you have any questions, please contact us. Thanks for helping your child demonstrate the remarkable learning that happens every day at Bennett Elementary, an IB World School!

VOLUNTEER MENTORS NEEDED

Fifth Grade Exhibition

Exhibition is the significant, culminating experience in the International Baccalaureate PYP (Primary Years Program). It is the final assessment of each student's development of the attributes of the learner profile. It represents Bennett's evaluation and celebration of its students' international mindedness, their continued school career, and each student's preparation for the 21st century. During exhibition, students consider real life issues or problems, select one to explore, research it, and do something about it. Exhibition concludes with student presentations about their inquiries and actions and a celebration of the learner and human being they are.

Mentors are not required to be experts in any area, but "consultants" who advise a small group of students as needed. No supplies or experience is needed. A guide is provided to aide in facilitating group

sessions. Training is provided to prepare mentors with the key elements of the PYP and give examples of past exhibitions.

Mentor commitments are about one hour twice per week for six consecutive weeks, all online.

Mentor Expectations

- 1. Attend Mentor training from (online, TBD time and date)
- 2. Meet twice a week with the same group of 5th grade students for six consecutive weeks April 12th May 20th.
- · Days of the week are flexible (you choose the two that work for you).
- · CMAS may impact the times of some meetings.
- · The last opportunity to "meet" with your group will be Wednesday, May 19th before the presentation day on Friday, May 21st.
- 3. Ask questions to encourage students' depth in thinking and questioning (inquiry), support students in securing experts for the student group to interview, guiding students during their planning and organization for taking action and presenting their inquiry to others. "Stretch their path to new heights on the exhibition journey, but let them steer."
- 4. Help students learn from situations that didn't go as planned through reflection and discussion. Help students get unstuck through looking at a problem differently.
- 5. Support students in setting goals each week.
- 6. Suggest resources that might be helpful in further research needed for deeper understanding, action, and/or presentation planning.
- 7. Aide in interpreting difficult information.
- 8. Facilitate interviews, telephone calls, communications with public (emails, letters, brochures, etc.) Students will need to have a script for verbal contacts or written communications approved by teachers first.

**Students are required to have Tdap prior to entry into 6th grade. One dose of Tdap is required for 6th through 12th grade

PSD protocols for Minor symptoms:

If symptoms resolve within 24 hours of onset and stay resolved an additional 24 hours, return to school. (48 hours total)

If symptoms resolve within 48 hours of onset and stay resolved an additional 24 hours, return to school. (72 hours total)

If symptoms DO NOT resolve within 48 hours, either:

- a. Follow home isolation for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.
- b. Get a polymerase chain reaction, or PCR, COVID-19 test. If test is negative, return to school once symptom-free for 24 hours. If positive, follow home isolation for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.
- 2. **No cost for meals:** Meals are free through the 2020-21 school year, as part of a U.S. Department of Agriculture school district reimbursement program. Parents are encouraged to still apply for free and reduced-priced meals, which helps with school funding (apply on the Free and Reduced-Priced Meals website).
- 3. If your child has an appointment after school, please come and pick them up by 3:00. You will need to come to the front door to check them out. This will allow you time to park and get them at the front door and miss the afterschool congestion.
- 4. Call the attendance line 488-4751 or enter an absence in ParentVue when your child will be out. If they are sick, please leave detailed information, so we know if there needs to be Covid related follow up.
