## VOLUNTEER MENTORS NEEDED

### Fifth Grade Exhibition

Exhibition is the significant, culminating experience in the International Baccalaureate PYP (Primary Years Program). It is the final assessment of each student's development of the attributes of the learner profile. It represents Bennett's evaluation and celebration of its students' international mindedness, their continued school career, and each student's preparation for the 21st century. During exhibition, students consider real life issues or problems, select one to explore, research it, and do something about it. Exhibition concludes with student presentations about their inquiries and actions and a celebration of the learner and human being they are.

Mentors are not required to be experts in any area, but "consultants" who advise a small group of students as needed. No supplies or experience is needed. A guide is provided to aide in facilitating group sessions. Training is provided to prepare mentors with the key elements of the PYP and give examples of past exhibitions.

Mentor commitments are about one hour twice per week for six consecutive weeks, all online.

#### Mentor Expectations

1. Attend Mentor training from (online, TBD time and date)
2. Meet twice a week with the same group of 5th grade students for six consecutive weeks April 12th - May 20th.
  - Days of the week are flexible (you choose the two that work for you).
  - CMAS may impact the times of some meetings.
  - The last opportunity to "meet" with your group will be Wednesday, May 19th before the presentation day on Friday, May 21st.
3. Ask questions to encourage students' depth in thinking and questioning (inquiry), support students in securing experts for the student group to interview, guiding students during their planning and

organization for taking action and presenting their inquiry to others. “Stretch their path to new heights on the exhibition journey, but let them steer.”

4. Help students learn from situations that didn't go as planned through reflection and discussion. Help students get unstuck through looking at a problem differently.

5. Support students in setting goals each week.

6. Suggest resources that might be helpful in further research needed for deeper understanding, action, and/or presentation planning.

7. Aide in interpreting difficult information.

8. Facilitate interviews, telephone calls, communications with public (emails, letters, brochures, etc.) Students will need to have a script for verbal contacts or written communications approved by teachers first.

## ICYMI:

### 1. **Class placement for 2021-2022**

We use a software program that sorts students for us based on certain parameters. The program helps us create balanced classes across the grade level. Teachers do not have names of teachers for the following school year when inputting the information for the next year class assignment. So, while you can't request a specific teacher for your child, you can give input on anything you want us to keep in mind about your child when inputting information such as; the environment that you feel your child best learns in, any students you hope can be placed with your child, any students you hope your child can be separated from, etc. The way to communicate this information is through our “parent input form” which you can find on the Bennett website. The form is available now and is due by April 12<sup>th</sup>. You can email the completed form to me at [asmythe@psdschools.org](mailto:asmythe@psdschools.org). The forms do not carry over from year to year, so, if you filled one out previously you will need to do a new one for this year. Thank you!

### 2. Following public health guidelines, PSD to allow voluntary shortened quarantines

PSD believes access to education is critical to student success. As allowed by [county](#) and state public health guidance, PSD staff and students can voluntarily end their quarantines early if they meet strict criteria and are approved by PSD COVID-19 Response Teams to do so. This goes into effect March 22 and is a change from PSD's previous protocols. Process information and criteria are available on the [PSD Protocols for COVID-19 web page >>](#)

- Please note, the shortened quarantine is not available if an entire class has shifted to Remote Learning. Students may not “test back” into class early because the classroom will remain closed to all until a date communicated by the school.
3. If your child has an appointment after school, please come and pick them up by 3:00. **You will need to come to the front door to check them out.** This will allow you time to park and get them at the front door and miss the afterschool congestion.
  4. Call the attendance line 488-4751 or enter an absence in ParentVue when your child will be out. If they are sick, please leave detailed information, so we know if there needs to be Covid related follow up.
  5. **All PSD elementary schools will be using enhanced contact tracing.** Classrooms will be kept together as a “cohort” and not mixed with other classes. If a student or staff member has a positive COVID test, the entire class will automatically be quarantined for 10 days.
