Tech Tips for a Successful Parent-Teacher Conference on Google Meet:

Be on the lookout for specific times, details, and links from your teacher about upcoming student conferences on Google Meet! This year's conferences will be held remotely, so to ensure the most successful conference, please keep these tips in mind while planning how you will meet with your teacher. While we've all learned and adapted to our remote world, there are some things that may work differently than you might expect due to how schools need to address privacy laws. Thanks for your support and understanding throughout this year - we've almost made it through!

- 1. We suggest using a laptop or desktop with a webcam if possible. Mobile devices and dialing in will work as well, but are more limiting.
- 2. A microphone is necessary for back and forth communication; and a camera is suggested for a more personal meeting.
- 3. On a desktop or laptop, we recommend using <u>Google Chrome</u> to access the Meet to avoid problems with compatibility.
- 4. If you are using a mobile device (smartphone or tablet), the device <u>may</u> require you to download Google Meet before allowing you to join. Downloading the app prior to the conference will ensure you will have the full scheduled time to talk about your child's progress.
- 5. Because PSD uses Google Workspace for Education which has enhanced privacy restrictions, you will be asked to sign on to a Google account when logging on to the Meet. Google for Education does not allow a person to be admitted anonymously like other versions of Google Meet. You may use your own personal Google account, or your child's PSD Google account for this Meet. Please wait patiently to be admitted in order to give time for the previous conference to be completed. If you need your

- child's PSD login information, please contact your classroom teacher so they can send you your child's username and password.
- 6. If you have technology concerns before the conference, feel free to contact your classroom teacher or email Mr. Woolner (kwoolner@psdschools.org).

PSD Technology Returns

ICYMI:

- There are new guidelines from the state regarding vaccine exemptions. Starting with the 2021-2022 school year, you must now have a health care provider sign the exemption form. You can read more about it on the state's health department website: https://cdphe.colorado.gov/vaccine-exemptions
- 2. Following public health guidelines, PSD to allow voluntary shortened quarantines

PSD believes access to education is critical to student success. As allowed by <u>county</u> and state public health guidance, PSD staff and students can voluntarily end their quarantines early if they meet strict criteria and are approved by PSD COVID-19 Response Teams to do so.
