# Reminders

- If your child arrives at school after the bell rings at 8:50, the student needs to enter through the office. If your student is riding their bike, and they are late they will need to lock it on the rack in front of the staff parking lot because the gate will be locked.
- Children need to bring a properly fitting mask every day. We also ask, if possible, that they have an extra one in their backpack.
- Unless an entire class is receiving an invitation to a party, we ask that you do not distribute party invitations at school. This will help to prevent hurt feelings. ### **Principal Note**

Hi families,

I just wanted to briefly tell you what the process is at school if we have a student who has a confirmed positive case of COVID-19. If a student in your child's class has a positive case, you will get a note from your child's teacher by email that will make you aware that there has been a case. You will get a note for every case that we get in your child's class. When there is a positive case, we must contact trace in the lunchroom as we are unable to be 6 feet apart and students are more than 15 minutes without a mask. During regular classroom time students are 3 feet apart and wearing their masks. We have seating charts for the lunchroom, so, if your child was a student who sits on either side or across from an infected student, they would be considered a close contact. In this case, you will receive an email from Bennett Office that we have identified your student as a close contact and one from the county Health Department detailing the quarantine requirements. (Please check your spam as a lot of the ones from the county are going to spam)!

If your child is quarantined for having COVID-19 or being a close contact, each grade level has a plan on how to provide your child with access to the new learning being taught as well as work to be completed while on quarantine. The teacher will reach out if you are quarantined. For more information, you can visit the district website and search for COVID-19 as they have all of the protocols that are followed at every school listed. # **Health Office**

1. The date to have all vaccine records or exemptions, is November 1. As a reminder, exemptions MUST be done every year. There are new requirements for exemptions. Vaccination exemption form requirements:

Two ways to file a nonmedical exemption, certificates and online education module:

- a. File the Certificate of Nonmedical Exemption WITH a signature from an immunizing provider, OR
- b. File the Certificate of Nonmedical Exemption received upon the completion of our online education module <u>Downloadable certificates and online education</u> <u>module are available on the CDPHE website here.</u>

#### **Vaccination Clinic**

Help keep your student safe and healthy for in-person learning this school year! Back-to-school vaccines will be available at no cost at the Larimer County Department of Health and Environment in Fort Collins for students who have Medicaid, health insurance that does not cover vaccines, and those who do not have health insurance. COVID-19 vaccines will also be available for anyone who is age 12 and older.

#### Families must have an appointment for their student.

**Who**: Youth who have Medicaid, insurance that doesn't cover vaccinations, and those who do not have health insurance are eligible

What: No cost for immunizations
